"Korn" returns with their 13th full-length-record, entitled "The Nothing."

Once the pioneers of "Nu-Metal," the band "Korn" now represent the grizzled veterans of the genre.

Right from the opening bagpipes of the first track, "Korn" seem ready to outdo their many imitators.

Nothing is subtle with "Korn" records because they are most comfortable in dissonant soundscapes.

Noteworthy track, and lead single, "Cold," thunders along with a "Sepultura-esque" barrage of metal.

Overall, "The Nothing" album contains 9 "Noteworthy Songs" & 4 "Below Average Songs."

The band "Korn" have chosen to "Walk A Thin Line," of slow, and heavy elements, such like they are vocalized in the compelling song, "Idiosyncrasy."

Hheavy, melodic, and uncompromising attention-to-detail is explored in the song, "Gravity Of Discomfort."

Introspective track, "Can You Hear Me," declares in the chorus, "We Will Never Be The Same Again," a hint of worldly, futuristic lamentation.

Nu-Metal still has "Nothing" greater to offer in the 21st century, other than a mature record by music band "Korn."
